Programa Básico

Estudio de las características formales y de las funciones sintácticas de los elementos de la lengua inglesa. Descripción y empleo de la oración compuesta en lengua inglesa (coordinación y subordinación). Estudio contextualizado de expresiones léxicas y vocabulario con fines específicos.

Objetivos

- Make use of their competence in English and capacity of creativity in order to produce short literary texts.
2. Make use of the organisation and workings of simple, compound and complex sentences in English in order to express themselves both in oral and written English.
3. Understand figurative expressions from their literal meanings, through their interaction with the pragmatic aspects of the discourse.
4. Understand fixed expressions as elements of everyday speech language and use them in their appropriate context.
