Writing a Research Paper

3 creds., 1st semester

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Aims and Objectives

The course aims to provide students with the necessary tools (formatting guidelines, academic language, bibliographic resources, methodology, etc.) that need to be taken into account to write successful research papers.

Course Program

- 1. Structuring and organising research papers
- 3. Academic language used in literary and linguistic research papers
- 4. Blending reference material into research papers: citations, plagiarism, formatting guidelines
- 5. Bibliographic and E-resources useful for literary and linguistic research papers

Methodology

Class meetings will consist of lectures and group discussions. Strong emphasis will be placed on practical exercises.

Assessment



An active participation will be required in our classes. Students are expected to prepare practical exercises and some readings which will be discussed in the corresponding sessions. In addition, a research paper is to be handed in on completion of this course. Students will be evaluated on a combination of their participation in class, their written assignments and final paper.
