7. General methodology and assessment from 13.03.2020

PROCEDURE 1 st call	%	OBSERVATIONS
Assignments	50%	Assignments will include practical exercises, which will be done individually or in groups. In order to carry them out, the students will be required to upload them to Moodle and/or email them on the date the assignments are due (the dates have been set up from the beginning of the course and are posted in Moodle). The grade corresponding to these assignments will be added to the final task.
Active online participation	5%	Active participation will be assessed on the students' capacity to provide reasoned arguments and to solve exercises via the Moodle Forum. The grade corresponding to active participation will be added to the final task.
Online final task	35%	The written final task will include exercises based on a critical reflection on issues discussed on the handouts and on the practical assignments. It will be uploaded on Moodle and/or emailed to the teacher.

*The remaining 10% corresponds to the already assessed tasks carried out by students as part of the continuous evaluation.

PROCEDURE 2 nd call	%	OBSERVATIONS
Assignment	30%	The assignment will be done in groups and include a practical task that must be uploaded to Moodle and/or emailed to the teacher.
Written task 1	35%	The 1 st written final task will include exercises based on a critical reflection on issues discussed on the handouts and on the practical assignments. It will be uploaded on Moodle and/or emailed to the teacher.
Written task 2	35%	The 2 nd written final task will include exercises similar to those included in the practice. It will be done through Moodle and/or emailed to the teacher.

*The students enrolled in the *Fin de Carrera* call will be assessed in terms of the final task only (100%). Tutorials will be carried out online for these students as well.
